

General Rules of Conduct

The following rules were adopted by the Council Camping Committee for the safety of campers, protection of camp facilities and equipment, and to provide fairness to all participating in the camp program.

1. The consumption, possession or use of alcohol in any form, and all controlled or illegal substances while on or near the premises of camp property is not permitted. Being under the influence or even having alcohol on the breath is a negative influence on our youth. Those individuals will be asked to leave, whether they are campers, leaders, staff, or visitors.
2. No firearms, bows, or arrows, of any kind may be kept in the possession of any Scout or Scouter. They must be checked in upon arrival at camp.
3. Absolutely no fireworks or ammunition of any kind are permitted at camp. The only exceptions to this are materials used in program activities supervised by the camp staff.
4. Liquid fuels are not permitted at camp. Propane may be used, but only under the supervision of an adult.
5. Please be careful.
6. No fires or open flames are allowed in or near tents. This includes self-contained stoves and lanterns, mosquito coils, citronella candles and other such items.
7. Sheath knives are not practical for the type of camping done at summer camp. Please do not allow your Scouts to bring them to camp.
8. Avoid using aerosol spray cans while at camp wherever possible.
9. Anyone leaving camp must check in at the Trading Post.
10. Leaders do not smoke in program areas, or anywhere in the presence of youth. Smoking is not permitted inside any camp structures.
11. Campers and RV's are not permitted in troop sites. At Camp Eastman, campers and RV's must be parked in the family camping areas. At Saukenauk, campers and RVs are not allowed at all.
12. No electricity is to be run to or generated in troop campsites. Electricity is available in Camp Eastman Wrens and Bluffs campsites. Troops wishing to use the electricity in these sites will be required to pay \$8.00 per day or part thereof. Electricity may not be used for cooking or air-conditioning.
13. Any person refusing to live within the rules of the camp, the Boy Scouts of America, or the State of Illinois may be told to leave camp.
14. All private vehicles are to be parked in the camp parking lot. Troop utility trailers can remain in the campsite, but vehicles cannot.
15. Bicycles are not permitted on camp property during summer camp.
16. No pets are to be brought to camp unless being kept and used in the Nature program area. This includes dogs, cats, rats, etc.
