

The Fox District Committee

The purpose of the District Committee is to guide, plan and support activities and units within the district. The District has four main functions. Membership, to recruit youth and adult members and to start new Scouting units. Program, to provide activities, training and advancement opportunities to out youth and units. Finance, to help pay for the program. And support, to ensure that units, leaders and youth are given the opportunity to get the most out of Scouting. The committee is made up of members elected by the district to serve annually. The District plans and conducts district activities like Camporees, Cub Fitness Day, District Pinewood Derbies and other District wide activities. The district also conducts leader-training sessions for Cub Leaders, Boy Scout and Venture Leaders, monthly roundtables and supports council trainings like Outdoor Leader Skills and Wood Badge. The district also supports units by helping with recruitment of youth and adult leaders, organizing new units and providing commissioners to give year round support to district units. Below are listed the key positions on the District Committee.

District Chair This is the top volunteer in a district. They are selected by the District Nominating Committee and elected at the Districts annual meeting. They are members of the Councils executive board to represent and report on the District. They appoint the other operating chairs of the District. They are a member of the District's Key Three.

District Commissioner The District Commissioner oversees the primary arm of the districts unit service component. Unit Commissioners. The District Commissioner recruits and appoints other commissioners to organize and conduct the monthly Roundtable as well as make regular visits to all units in the District. They sit on the Council Commissioner Cabinet representing their District. They are a member of the District's Key Three.

District Executive This is the professional Scouter assigned to serve the District. They are there to provide guidance and assistance to the District Committee, district units and Scouting volunteers. They ensure that National guidelines and policies are upheld and provide a full time presence representing the District with the Council. They are a member of the District's Key Three.

Assistant District Commissioners These individuals assist the District Commissioners in the performance of their duties. They often times oversee a sub group within a District assisting in the recruitment, training and service of Unit Commissioners within that sub group in the District.

Nominating Committee Chair This individual is selected by the District Chairman and approved by the Council President to oversee the annual Nominating Committee process. The Nominating Committee recruits influential and knowledgeable people within the District to serve as District Chair, District Commissioner and voting members of the District. They present these people for election at the Districts Annual meeting.

District Finance Vice Chair This person oversees the fund raising activities of the District. These include Friends of Scouting (FOS), popcorn sales and special fundraisers like Walk for Camps.

District Program Vice Chair This person oversees the program aspects of the District. These include camping, training, and advancement.

District Membership Vice Chair This person oversees overall membership in the District. This includes Spring and Fall Recruitment, New Unit organization, Troop Open House, School Nights, Tiger Prowls and retention of units and youth membership.

District FOS Chair This person coordinates all parts of the annual District FOS campaign. During the campaign they are part of the monthly Council FOS teleconferences that monitor the progress of each years campaign. They support the Family and Community FOS Chairs in meeting their goals.

Family FOS Chair This person recruits and trains family FOS presenters, contacts units to set up FOS presentation and reports to the District FOS Chair.

Community FOS Chair This person recruits and trains community FOS workers. They monitor the progress of the Community FOS campaign and develop new prospect lists to ensure FOS goals are met.

District Popcorn Colonel This individual heads up the District Popcorn sale. They contact units, organize kick off and victory activities and ensure that units have the materials and support they need to successfully meet their popcorn selling goals. They participate in Council Popcorn meetings to develop and analyze the Councils annual Popcorn Sale.

Walk for Camps Chair This individual head the Districts annual Walk for Camp activity. They plan and organize the District event. They contact units to promote participation and awareness and serve on the Council Walk committee to develop and analyze the Councils Walk for Camps program.

District Activities and Civic Service Chair This person oversees the planning of District Camporees and other activities. This position also coordinates civic service in the District. If service hours are requested from Boy Scouts the Civic Service Chair contacts units to find enough Scouts to assist in various community service projects.

District Training Chair This person oversees and conducts training for all levels of the Scouting program. They serve on the Councils Training Committee.

District Advancement Chair This person monitors unit advancement within the District. They serve on the Council Advancement Committee and develop and maintain the District Merit Badge Councilor list.

District Camping Chair The District Camping chair helps promote camping within the District. They represent the district on the Council Camping Committee and the Saukenauk Camping sub-committee.

Cub Scout Day Camp Coordinator This person coordinates Day Camp Activities within the District. They serve on the Day Camp Staff and help develop the annual Day Camp program theme and activities.

Good Turn for America Chair This person oversee the annual Scouting for Food Drive within the District as well as any Scouting for Healthy Living and Scouting for Shelter activities within the District. They serve on the Council GTFA Committee.

Learning for Life Chair This person helps coordinate and organize LFL (in school values based and career awareness programs) and the Exploring program within a District. They serve on the Council LFL Committee.

Venturing Chair The Venturing Chair helps promote the BSA Venturing Program and helps plan activities for Venture aged youth within the Council. They serve on the Council Venturing Committee.
