# Camp Rules and Regulations

**DEN CODE OF CONDUCT:** The den leader and the boys in the den should develop a den code of conduct—or set of group rules. Introduce the subject of a den code of conduct during an open discussion of how friends act toward one another. Boys will often contribute proposals that relate to safety, to respect for property, and to relationships with others. This will help the Scout at Camp.

- Camp Code**                      The Scout Oath and Law will be the law of the camp.
- Roster**                              The Unit Roster form, enclosed in this manual or equivalent, must be completed and turned in at Check-In. Please make additional copies as needed.
- Tobacco**                            No person under the age of 18 is allowed to use tobacco products. Violators will be asked to leave. All adult smokers are encouraged to refrain from smoking around the Scouts during the weekend.
- Dress Code**                        Field (Class A) or Activity (Class B) uniforms are encouraged throughout the duration of the campout. No inappropriate civilian clothes are permitted. Closed toed shoes must be worn around camp for safety.
- Prohibited***                        *Alcohol, fireworks, firearms, and non-medically prescribed drugs are all strictly prohibited.*

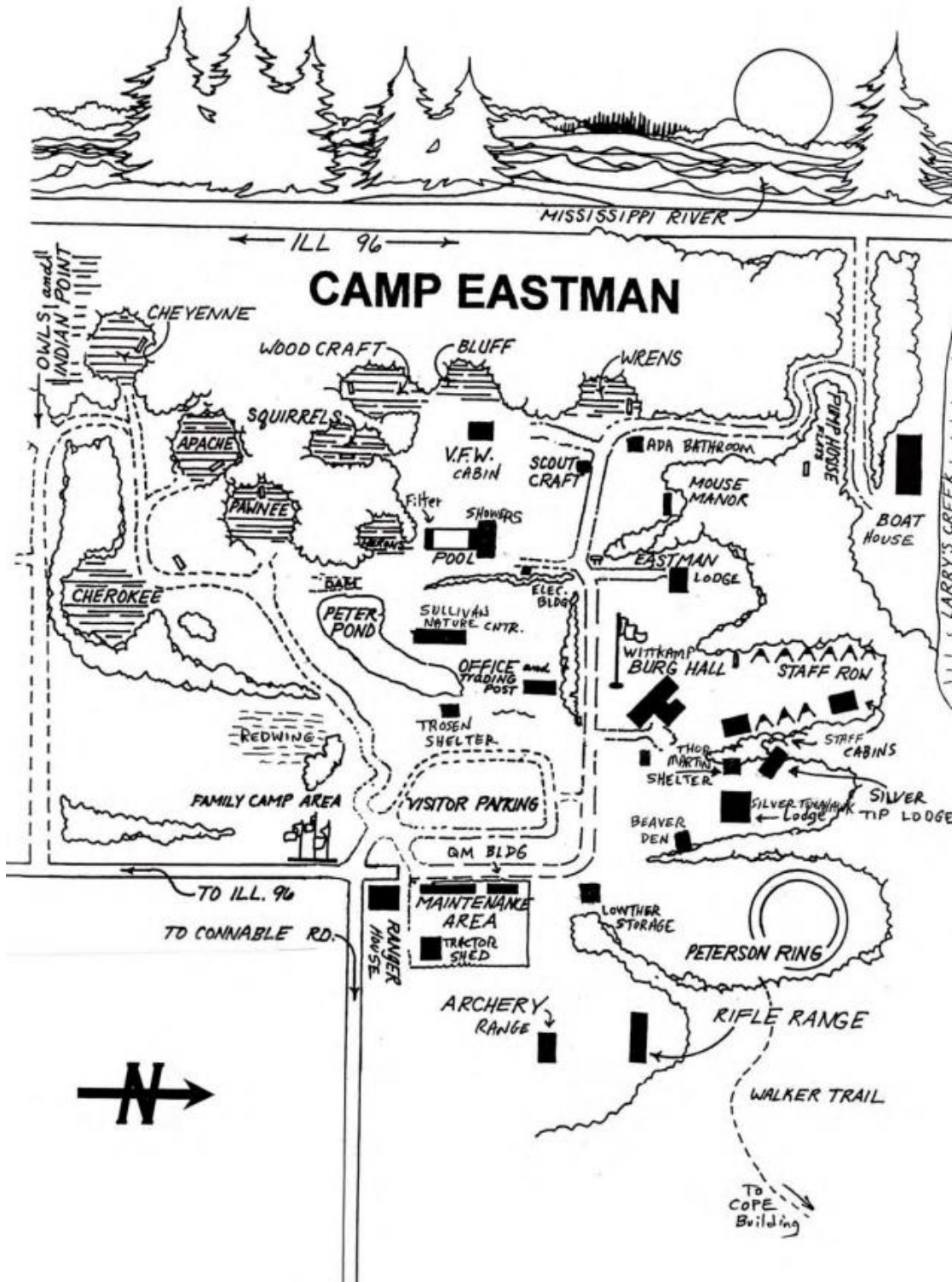

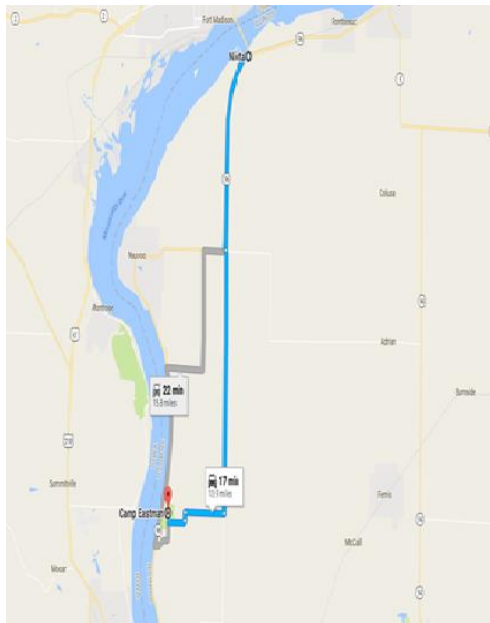

0.2 mi

Continue onto E Co Rd 1780  
0.8 mi

## FROM QUINCY

Take US-24 E/N 4th St to IL-110 E/IL-336 N  
in Ellington Township.

Continue on IL-96 N through Hamilton, IL  
along the River Road
