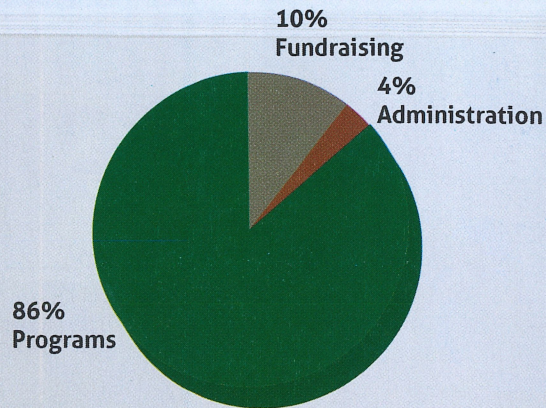


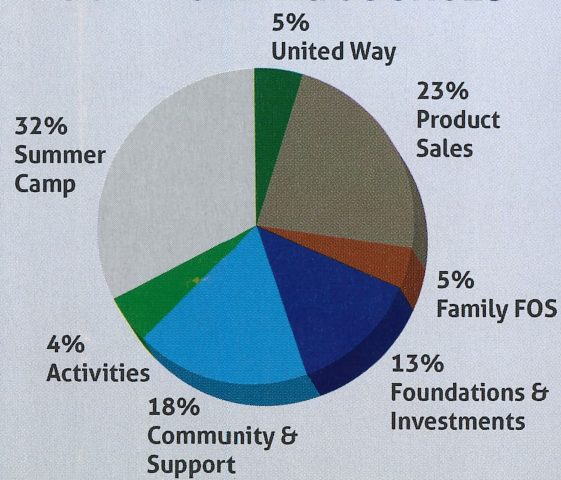
YOUR DONATION STAYS WITHIN OUR COMMUNITY

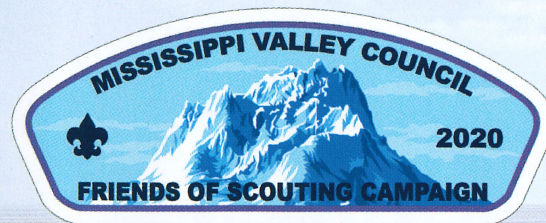

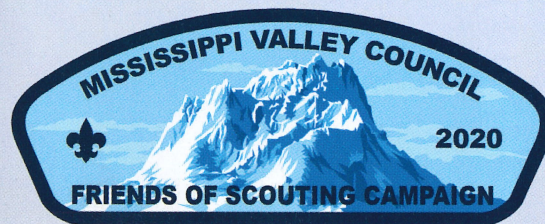

Membership Recruitment Resources

Camp Equipment:

Utilities, insurance, repairs and care for our Quincy Scout Service Center and Burlington Scout Service Center

Council Communications:

Our newsletter, website, social media, and information technology to keep everyone informed.

A/V Supplies:

Used in training, camp promotion, activities and much more.

Professional Staff:

Our executive staff assists in creating new units, training, fundraising, membership recruitment, counseling and guidance for your district, camps and programs.
