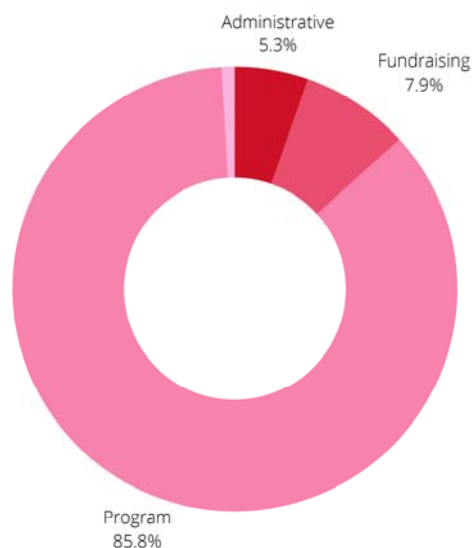

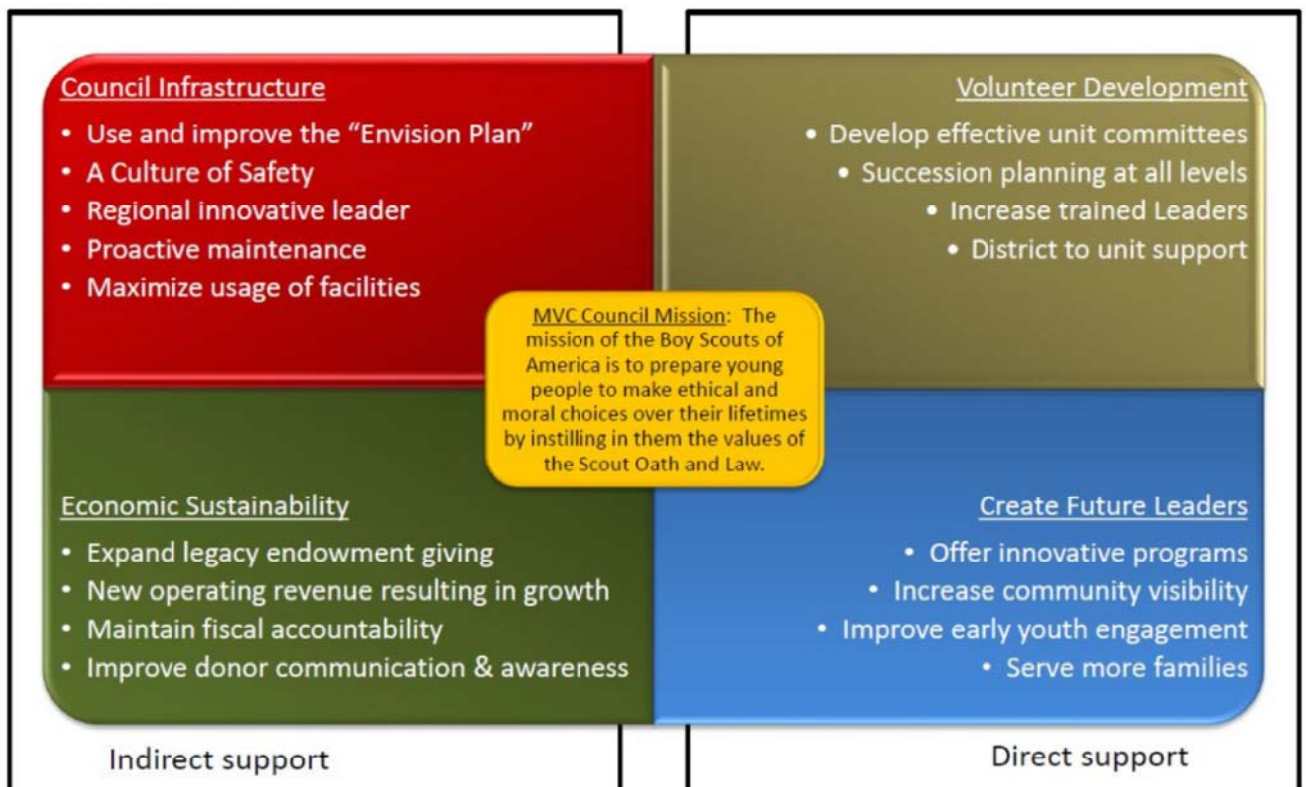
2023 PREVIEW
